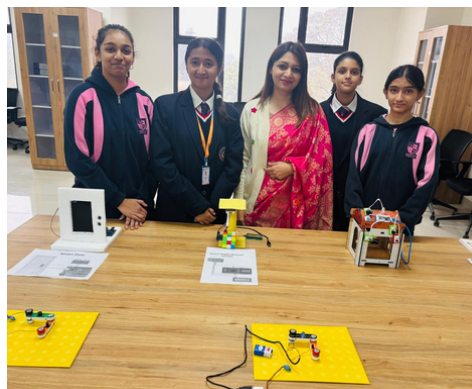

Humans vs AI:

Artificial Intelligence is no longer a futuristic idea from science fiction. It writes emails, recommends what we should watch, helps doctors analyze medical scans, drives cars, and even composes music. The truth is less dramatic than a showdown and more interesting than a rivalry. The story of humans vs AI is really a story about how humans create tools—and how those tools reshape what it means to be human.

What AI Does Well:

AI is exceptional at handling large amounts of data quickly and accurately. It can scan millions of documents in seconds, identify patterns invisible to the human eye, and perform repetitive tasks without getting tired. In fields like healthcare, AI helps detect diseases early. In finance, it identifies fraud. In education, it personalizes learning for students.

AI doesn't get distracted. It doesn't forget. It doesn't need sleep.

But AI's strengths are also its limits. It works based on patterns, data, and instructions. It doesn't understand meaning the way humans do. It doesn't have personal experience, emotions, or moral judgment.

What Humans Do Best

Humans excel in areas where AI struggles: creativity, empathy, intuition, and ethical reasoning. Humans don't just process information, they interpret it through feelings, culture, and lived experience. We can imagine things that don't yet exist. We can break rules creatively.

The Fear of Replacement

One major concern is that AI will take away jobs. History shows that every major technological shift—from the industrial revolution to the internet—changed the job market. Some roles disappeared, but many new ones were created.

When Intelligence Turns Artificial—and Dangerous

AI was once a topic of discussion for science fiction. The thought of robots which can simulate human intelligence was random and delusional to people. But, in the 21st century, it is now a completely real thing and has become a thing people use commonly, adults and children alike. But, is this perfect-looking helper actually just good? The short answer is no. AI has taken over the minds of the new and young generations and is ruining our planet while it's at it.

Firstly, AI has significantly decreased our intelligence and creativity, with children and adults resorting to it instead of figuring out issues themselves. People have started overusing AI, not recognizing their own deterioration in creativity. Earlier, books and sometimes the internet were the way people found knowledge, but now AI has taken over. Companies like Google, which started as search engines, have also introduced AI assistance which gives us summaries, which are sometimes incorrect, to our searches. This means that even when we use the internet to gain knowledge, we soon won't be reading articles but will be reading AI-powered summaries. Children are encouraged by AI companies to use their AI as it is an "easier solution to their problems." Before, it was easy to detect AI, but now people have made humanizers, which effectively make AI-produced text undetectable. Studies show that the use of AI has increased ten-fold in the past two years.

AI farms, which contain the servers on which AI works, use fresh, drinkable water to cool down their systems, effectively making perfectly drinkable water absolutely poisonous for consumption. Water that could have helped millions of unfortunate households is poisoned and dumped. This water is also often dumped into rivers, effectively killing off entire ecosystems, even endangered ones. In the past year, more than 1,000 gallons of water were used by AI farms—1,000 gallons of water which could have helped people drink fresh water and 1,000 or more gallons of water which destroyed ecosystems. The prices of RAM and other electronic appliances have also increased a lot since AI became famous, with RAM going from \$20 to \$90 in a month. People who saved for months were unable to buy the appliances they needed, causing people to protest against AI.

With all the above points, it is safe to say AI is not good for us and our planet. We need to find better ways of gaining information and knowledge. We need to stop using AI as much as we are right now, and we need to prevent our future generations from thinking that using AI is completely right and has no consequences.

Edward Teller

Edward Teller, born on January 15, 1908 in Budapest, Austria was an American-Hungarian physicist who is widely known as the “father of the hydrogen bomb” for creating a bomb capable of eradicating a continent. After emigrating to America in the 1930’s with a group of “Martians” who were extremely skilled Hungarian scientist émigrés, he made multiple contributions to nuclear and molecular physics. In 1942, he was invited to be part of Robert Oppenheimer’s Manhattan project, aiming to make the USA’s first nuclear weapons. Here was when he first got the idea that a weapon based on nuclear fission could be used to create a greater weapon based on nuclear fusion. At the Berkeley session, Teller diverted the discussion from the fission weapon to the possibility of a fusion weapon—what he called the "Super", an early conception of the hydrogen bomb.

On April 18–20, 1946, Teller participated in a conference at Los Alamos to review the wartime work on the Super. The properties of thermonuclear fuels such as deuterium and the possible design of a hydrogen bomb were discussed. At the end of the conference, Teller submitted a positive report that the hydrogen or thermonuclear bomb was feasible and further work should be done for its creation, even after opposition of other members like Robert Serber. With Jon von Neumann, Teller contributed the idea of using implosion to set off the bomb. The model of Teller's "classical Super" was so uncertain that Oppenheimer would later say that he wished the Russians were building their own hydrogen bomb based on that design, as it would almost certainly delay their progress on it. The breakthrough—the details of which are still classified—was apparently the separation of the fission and fusion components of the weapons, and to use the X-rays produced by the fission bomb to first compress the fusion fuel (by a process known as "radiation implosion") before igniting it. Ulam's idea seems to have been to use mechanical shock from the primary to encourage fusion in the secondary, while Teller quickly realized that X-rays from the primary would do the job much more symmetrically. Whatever the actual components of the so-called Teller–Ulam design and the respective contributions of those who worked on it, after it was proposed, it was immediately seen by the scientists working on the project as the answer that had been so long sought. In 1952, the first ever thermonuclear bomb explosion was led out, creating an explosion many times larger than expected. His led to the beginning of multiple debates worldwide about the ethics of nuclear weapons and warfare, ultimately leading to the establishment of the treaty on the prohibition of nuclear weapons (TPNW), preventing the use of such a disastrous bomb.

Today, the hydrogen bomb remains as a symbol of power and fear. Teller’s legacy is complex, shaping our world forever. If a nuclear war would break out, the hydrogen bob will be the one to end it with the possibility of ending the population of entire continents.

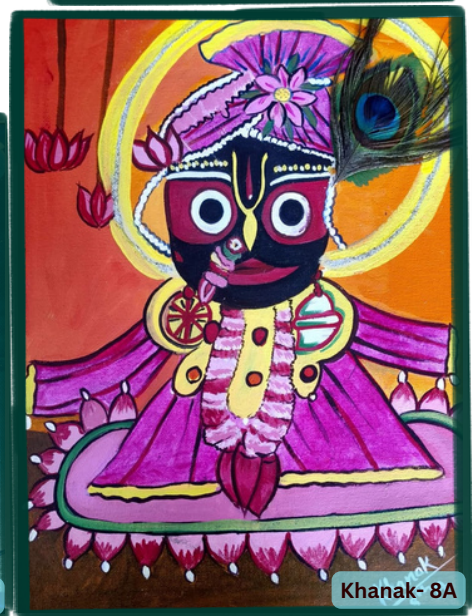
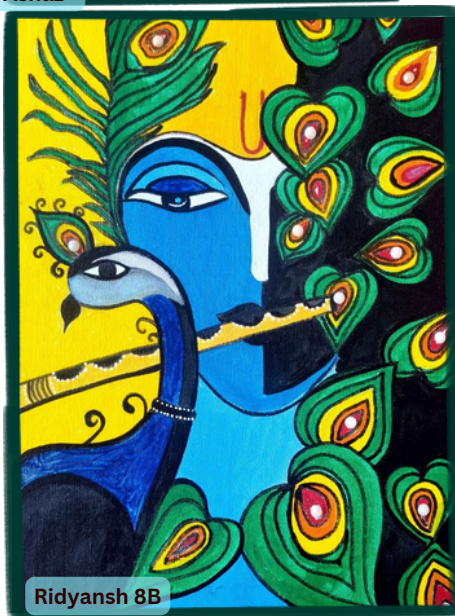
